The conference is part of a 10-day exchange programme for students and lecturers in social work and is sponsored by the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD). In addition to the two-day academic programme, numerous civil society actors will participate and visit networks, educational programmes and institutions related to the Sustainable Development Goals.
